## **Don't forget** your daily 4.0!









Our Students are back and the fall 2020 Semester starts today. As we officially start this reinvented semester, all members of the community are asked to remember a simple idea: Protect. Respect. Do your part. As part of those efforts, all students and employees who come on to campus will be required to complete a COVID-19 screening, every day, seven days a week. Completion of this screening is necessary to remain in compliance with university policy. Individuals will be required to begin completing the screening on the first day of classes, Aug. 17. The daily screener is quick and easy. It takes less than 3-5 seconds if you don't have symptoms. Any employee with an on-campus work assignment will receive a daily email with instructions for completing the screening. If you do not have regular access to email, your supervisor will provide a paper copy of the screen.

The SKYblue Solar House is headed to a new home. The solar house, currently located on the south lawn of the Cooper House at the corner of S. Limestone and Farm Road, was constructed in 2008 by a team of UK faculty, staff, and students. The project was part of the 2009 US Department of Energy Solar Decathlon. The facility also served as Lexington's Welcome Center during the 2010 World Equestrian Games and has hosted hundreds of tours teaching thousands about the potential for residential solar power in Kentucky. Earlier this year, UK's Board of Trustees voted to sell the house via Surplus Property. The RFP for potential buyers included a clause that prioritized offers that would keep the facility available to UK Students. An offer that did just that was accepted and the house is currently being readied (by the buyer) for transport to its new home.
