At the end of May the Rooftop Chiller that supplies the MRI's and CT scanners in Gill Heart Institute failed. A temporary rental chiller was brought in to feed these areas. **Medical Center Facilities Management Staff** worked quickly with engineers to specify a new chiller for replacement. The demolition of the Kirwan Blanding Complex continues on schedule. As you approach the area on Woodland Avenue, the towers are no longer visible above the oaks that line the walks. Last week, staff from Utilities and Energy Management permanently disconnected the final wires feeding the complex. At right, Jacob Mendoza, UEM High Voltage, worked on new cable supports in preparation of an access expansion in the area.





The final phase of utility replacement on Rose St got underway last week on the section between Washington Ave and Huguelet Dr. The area has been fenced off and a trench now bisects the road providing access to the underground utilities. This project, combined with the Library Drive Extension project profiled last week, paves the way for the permanent closure of Rose Street to all but emergency vehicles between Huguelet Dr. and Columbia Ave. The sidewalks on either side of the street remain open so pedestrian access to and through the area is unimpeded.
