As we begin the transition of seasons here in the bluegrass, we feature our second piece this week on how our teams are preparing for cooler weather. As **Tree** (**Harold Sandford**) put it, "Our heating plants are truly the life blood of the campus during winter months. Without the steam they provide, nothing could go on inside our buildings." **Utilities and Energy Management** is responsible for the operation of the plants, but all of our teams support the plants with their unique skill sets. At left, **Jerry Keefer**, a master electrician with **Central Shops**, performs work on a panel in the Central Heating Plant 1 (adjacent to Peterson) to get it ready for winter building loads. The three central heating plants on our campus produce steam using a combination of natural gas and coal. Over the past few years, natural gas has emerged as our primary fuel source due to a variety of factors and now accounts for approximately 90% of campus steam production.

The Library Drive Extension connecting Washington Avenue to Funkhouser Drive is now open. This important addition to our roadway infrastructure literally paves the way for an important step in our Campus Master Plan: Making Rose Street a permanent pedestrian zone from Columbia Avenue to Huguelet Drive. Our capital construction projects will begin to pivot away from using Rose Street to access their sites as soon as project logistics allow. This campus enhancement promotes both safety and efficient access for service, emergency, and delivery vehicles.
