Due to the pandemic, UK Dining shifted to serving primarily bottled and canned beverages at their residential dining facilities. Our team noted this shift and worked to create signage to promote proper disposal of the containers.

With cooler weather arriving, and our chilled water production ramping down, they are performing upgrades and maintenance on those systems. Last week, UEM's Eric Paullin (at right in photo) worked with Rob Powers from Johnson Controls to reprogram the tower sequence in Cooling Plant #1 to provide more efficient and fail safe operations. UEM's Cooling plant teams also drained and started cleaning multiple basins and condensers in preparation for the winter months.
