Wayback Wednesday – The Matthews House and Garden

Clarence Wentworth Matthews was dean of the UK College of Agriculture from 1908-1910. He built his home at 660 S. Limestone a few years in the early 1900s and planted a garden on the south lawn, now at the corner of Limestone and Washington. The Matthews Building, home of UK PR, is also named in his honor. The House and Garden became part of the University in 1968, though his daughter Ruth Matthews lived in the house and tended the garden until her death in 1986. Today, the garden is maintained by the Biology Department and the 0.6 acre plot is home to more the 350 species of plants. The photo at left is from a snowy day in 1914.
