

Today is Veteran's Day in the United States. The history of this holiday dates back over 100 years to November of 1919 when President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed November 11, 1919 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day. In 1938, Armistice Day was established as a legal holiday, "to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day'." In 1954, President Eisenhower changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day and designated that November 11 would be a day to honor American Veterans of all wars. **THANK YOU TO ALL FACILITIES MANAGEMENT STAFF WHO HAVE SERVED.**



Wayback Wednesday – In honor of Veteran's Day, our look back at the history of our facilities highlights Cooper Village. This campus housing development originated in 1945 as a "G.I. City" consisting of 324 prefabricated housing units for married veterans. This was in response to the high number of veteran's enrolling at UK thanks to the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944 (GI Bill). This legislation was created to help veterans of World War II. It established hospitals, made low-interest mortgages available and granted stipends covering tuition and expenses for veterans attending college or trade schools. The prefabricated units were removed and replaced in 1956 by seven graduate and family apartment buildings (Cooperstown). In 2015, the Cooperstown buildings were removed and replaced by the Woodland Glen Residence Halls for undergraduate Students.
