



Wayback Wednesday – Commonwealth Stadium

In honor of the Wildcats victory on Saturday, today's trip back through time is football-focused. Commonwealth Stadium, the original name for UK's current home field, was built in 1973. Fun fact: at 47 years old it is the newest stadium in the Southeastern Conference. The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Grounds in honor of the former UK Athletics Director. The stadium had a capacity of 57,800 when built and that was increased to more than 67,000 by renovation in 1999 that also added suites in each corner. The facility was renamed Kroger Field following extensive renovations in 2015 that transformed many aspects of the stadium.
