

Project Update: Kirwan Blanding Demolition

Our work to safely deconstruct the Kirwan Blanding Complex and create a new, signature campus space continues on schedule. **Keith Ingram**, project manager for **Capital Projects Management**, reports that the top four floors of Kirwan Tower (foreground) and the top floor of Blanding Tower (background) have been removed and that it is taking approximately 7-8 days to remove a complete floor. The Kirwan I and II low rises have also been demolished to the ground floor slabs. Five of the remaining six low rises have been remediated and window wells have been removed. All five of these buildings are gutted down to the concrete masonry interior walls. After all buildings are demolished and cleared, the basements and tunnels will be demolished and backfilled.
