TIME FOR EVERYONE TO REGISTER FOR VACCINE

Last week, President Capilouto relayed the announcement that everyone in Kentucky that is 16 or older will be eligible to receive a Covid-19 vaccine starting April 12. He also urged everyone in our community (not just those on campus) to go ahead and register for the vaccination at ukvaccine.org. UK and UK HealthCare are operating the largest vaccination clinic in Kentucky, administering vaccines to more than 4,000 people a day. We’ve now provided more than 140,000 doses, representing some 100,000 people.



DON'T FORGET YOUR DAILY SCREENINGS

Employees who come to campus for their work assignments are required to complete a COVID-19 screening, every day, seven days a week, regardless of how many days per week they come to campus. The daily screener is quick, easy, and takes less than 3-5 seconds if you don't have symptoms.

Any employee with an on-campus work assignment will receive a daily email with instructions for completing the screening. If you do not have regular access to email, your supervisor will provide a paper copy of the screen.
