Dental Science DLAR Air Handling Unit Replacement



Last week a talented team completed a 14 day renovation of a major Air Handling Unit (AHU) at the Dental Wing of the Division of Laboratory Animal Resources (DLAR). Completing this large scale facility upgrade in that tight of a window required careful planning, great communication, and skilled execution. Huge shout out to the FMMC Outage Team (David Moody & Austin Ayers), FMMC Project Team (Jamie Carpenter), UEM Controls Team (Jason Goodpaster, David Mullins, Bobbie Tincher & Victoria Allison) and contract partners TP Mechanical (Aaron Scott & Stacy Hendrix). By completing the job so quickly, the team was able to avoid an estimate \$250,000 in costs

including rental fees for a temporary unit and the fees for a second crane operation. FMMC Engineering and Project Management Manager **Tina Arthur** praised the team's work saying,

"This is a prime example of what a seasoned project manager brings to the table. The foresight to plan well in advance to avoid a temporary unit. The forward thinking to impact the users as little as possible.
