The University of Kentucky's Recycling Program once again placed Give and Go Donation Stations in the lobby of every residence hall on campus for students to drop off the items they wish to donate as they prepare to leave campus for the semester break. Items collected can vary from clothes, shoes, bedding and unused toiletries, to furniture, décor and nonperishable food. Nonfood items will be donated to Goodwill and all food will be donated to the Big Blue Pantry to help fellow students. The Give and Go Donation Station program is a collaboration among several UK departments — Recycling, Trucking, Residence Life, Campus Housing, Auxiliary Services, Sustainability, Big Blue Pantry and Goodwill Industries of the Bluegrass. The goal of the program is to encourage students to donate rather than throw out usable items. This year a total 7.3 tons was collected, including more than 5000 lbs. of food (left) a number UK recycling was very happy with considering the unknowns of the semester due to COVID-19.
