10. Please describe the project, its goals, and how it contributes to UK student knowledge, attitudes & culture, or practices of the 3 pillars of sustainability (i.e. economic, environmental and social).

The project is to fund five students to participate in the LEED Green Associate Training on November 11th on UK's campus. LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) is an initiative begun by the U.S. Green Building Council in an effort to transform the built environment to become sustainable and healthy. The LEED system ranks buildings by awarding points for sustainable building practices. LEED is the most widely used sustainable building program in the world and provides benchmarks for architects, interior designers, and engineers to achieve when designing their buildings.

LEED provides students and professionals with the opportunity to become LEED Green Associates. To become an associate, an individual must exhibit their knowledge of current sustainable building practices on an exam and be committed to a professional future in the building industry. On November 11th, *Leading Green* is offering a class on UK's campus that educates students on these practices and meets the exam's eligibility requirements. Our project aims to increase the number of students attending the class by providing financial assistance to five students selected by an application process.

13. Describe the intended University of Kentucky audiences and potential number of people impacted including any potential diverse segments such as student or community organizations and supporting evidence (e.g. expected or historical event/speaker attendance).

The intended audience includes architecture, interior design and engineering students. A call for applications will be sent as an email announcement to students in AIAS (American Institute of Architecture Students), IDSA (Interior Design Student Association), the UK College of Design and the UK College of Engineering. Presentations will also be made at AIAS and IDSA November meetings. Seven students will learn more about the LEED program by giving presentations about the class or reviewing applications directly (four project leaders, three application reviewers). Five students will benefit directly from the scholarship by attending the LEED Green Associate Training for free.

14. Are there any students involved in the proposed project? If so, do they benefit from professional or technical skills, outputs, or experiences such as presentations, posters, or reports?

There are four students involved in making this class accessible to our respective student organizations and departments. Three different, unbiased students will review the applications. The five students that would attend the class would receive professional development *specifically* in sustainable building practices. They would be eligible to take the LEED exam to become leaders in their fields on sustainability.

Sadie Meyer is an at-large member of the Student Sustainability Council and submitted a proposal for the Beaux Arts Foundation that was partially funded in the Spring of 2015.

The American Institute of Architecture Students submitted a proposal in the Spring of 2015 for a lecturer and was granted funding.
